2. Call BRAIN-be for biodiversity research

The Council of Ministers approved on 5 October 2012, the launch of the first phase (2012-2018) of the recurrent Research Framework Programme <u>BRAIN-be</u> (Belgian Research Action through Interdisciplinary Networks). The funding programme is organised around six themes:

Ecosystems, biodiversity, life history Geosystems universe and climate Cultural, historical and scientific heritage Federal government strategies Major societal challenges Collections Management

3. Call for nominations for the 2013 Ebbe Nielsen Prize (GBIF)

The Global Biodiversity Information Facility (<u>GBIF</u>) invites nominations for the 2013 <u>Ebbe Nielsen Prize</u>, awarded annually to a person or team who demonstrates excellence in combining biodiversity informatics and biosystematics research.

The €30,000 award is intended to allow the recipient(s) to engage in biosystematics/biodiversity informatics research outside his/ her/ their country of residence for a period of 3-6 months.

Belgian individuals or institutions that wish to be nominated should motivate their candidacy to the Belgian Head of Delegation, <u>François Guissart</u> by February 1st 2013. The Belgian selection committee will nominate a body of recent and current research that demonstrates excellence, novelty and innovation in advancing the integration of biodiversity science and informatics.

4. Call for proposals for the 2013 Young Researchers Award (GBIF)

The Global Biodiversity Information Facility (<u>GBIF</u>) invites proposals from graduate students for the 2013 <u>Young</u> <u>Researchers Award</u>. This prize intends to foster innovative research and discovery in biodiversity informatics.

Two awards of €4,000 will be available to graduate students in a master's or doctoral programme. Belgian students are invited to submit their proposal to the Head of the Belgian GBIF Delegation, <u>François Guissart</u>.
