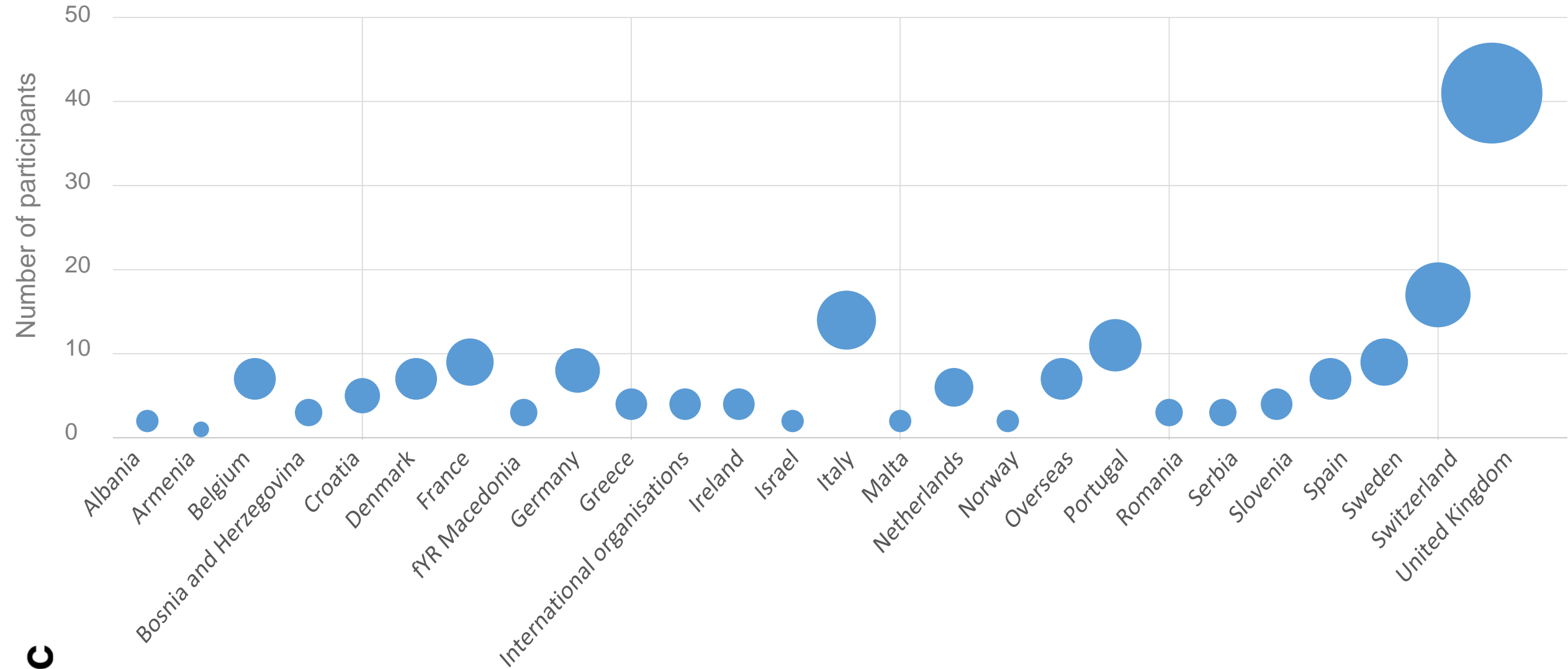

Rationale, structure and aims

- Lack of
 - Standardised methods, approaches and data to evaluate One Health activities
 - Robust evidence base for informed decision-making and resource allocation
- Open network, EU COST funded, 4 years
- Vision: To develop and use methods and frameworks for improved One Health decision making
- Activities:
 - Development of evaluation handbook
 - Application to case studies
 - Meta-analysis
 - Dissemination and stakeholder engagement

Bridging disciplines

- Members have **expertise** in animal health, human health, ecology, animal welfare, economics, epidemiology, microbiology, geography, business informatics, education, anthropology, evaluation, among others
- We propose to view One Health as a **systems approach** to complex health challenges
 - Which is operational through One Health thinking, planning and working
 - Which relies One Health learning, sharing and systemic organisation
 - Which results in social, environmental and economic outcomes as pillars of sustainability
